AFTERNOON SESSION.

Jan. 15, 1902.

At two o'clock, the Warden calls the Council to order, upon which a motion is made by Coun. Morton, seconded by Coun. Richard, that the Warden appoint a Committee of three to confer and make arrangements with the Royal Bank of Canada at Rexton, to horrow an amount of money not to exceed the February 18. sue of the School Warrant. The motion was carried, and the following committee appointed: Warden Jardine, Coun. B. J. Johnson, and Sylvain Barrieau.

Barrieau, that beginning with this session, all bills with which Councillors are personally interested, whether for pay or otherwise, shall be submitted to, and considered by the Council in full session, and such bills before being submitted will have to be sworn. Carried.


