
WAR OFFICE SPENT MORE THAN \$7,500,000 IN CANADA.

Ottawa, June 13-(Special)-The following are the amounts of food stuffs which have been supplied by Canada on account of the Imperial war office up to June 5, 1902:

Hay, 195,600 tons; flour, 125,815 sacks; Beef, 40,776 cases, jams, 11,743 cases; oats, 294,772 bags;. Three ship loads of hav are yet to go forward this month. Besides the supplies there have been several consignments of manufactured goods sent by private firms. The above goods represent an expenditure by the war office in Canada of more than \$7,. 500.000.


