The Fredericton Board of Trade Favours the Proposed Railway from Chipman to Kent Junction. At a meeting of the Council of the Fredericton Board of Trade held on Friday last the following resolution moved by Mr. J. D. Phinney was unanimously adopted.

The Council of the Fredericton Board of Trade having had before them Mr. Gilmour Brown, C. E., one of the promoters of a proposed line of railway from Chipman, the eastern terminus of the New Brunswick Coal and Railway Company's line, to Kent Junction, the western terminus of the Kent Northern Railway running to Richibucto, and having heard his statements and estimates, and carefully considered the advantages to be derived by this city and county from the construction of the said road and the further proposed steamboat connection between Richibucto and Prince Edward Island, desire to express themselves most favorably to the proposed scheme with the hope that the Legislature will pass the act incorporating the proposed company and assist the enterprise with the usual subsidy to which in our opinion it is fully entitled.
