Fattening Chicken Station

Mr. F. C. Hare, chief of the Dominion Poultry Division, Experimental Farm, Ottawa, has organized a fattening station at Rogersville, and has appointed Mr. Fidele Richard, Postmaster of that place, operator and agent. The Department will pay 6c. per pound live weight, for chickens weighing from 3 to 4 lbs, and will fatten them at government expense, to be shipped to the English markets. Leau chickens, provided they are pure bred or well graded Plymouth Rocks or Wyandotts of proper size and weight, are preferred. No black legs taken, only vellow or white legs. In order to encourage the new industry and benefit the farmers generally, the same price will be paid at distant places for proper kind. Crates will be sent free and freight to Rogersville station. Further, the Department will distribute through the agent at Rogersville, this fall at reasonable price, chickens of desired breed, to applicants, and eggs next spring, to introduce the required breed. 
