

verage of the last two years, amounts to thirty-eight thousand one hundred and twenty-five pounds currency, and the amount of the Civil List according to the estimate herewith transmitted, amounts to nineteen thousand five hundred pounds. It is not however necessary to call upon the legislature to grant the whole sum of nineteen thousand five hundred pounds, inasmuch as by the Provincial Act of the 35th of Geo. 3, the sum of five thousand pounds is permanently granted towards the maintenance of the Civil Government, the moderate sum of fourteen thousand five hundred pounds, is therefore all that is deemed necessary to ask for the completion of the proposed arrangement.

It is proposed that the duration of the Civil List should be for the life of His Majesty.

It is hoped that the arrangements thus detailed will be received in the spirit of conciliation and confidence.

His Majesty is prepared to surrender a large and increasing Revenue; he asks in return for a fixed and moderate Civil List much less in amount than the Revenue given up; and the settlement of this long agitated question will be deemed by His Majesty one of the happiest events of his Reign, the glory of which (the people of Canada may be assured,) will be the promotion of the happiness and content of all classes of his subjects in every quarter of the globe.

The Governor in Chief having thus obeyed the commands he has received in making the foregoing communication to the House of Assembly, desires to add that if in the course of their proceedings on this important question, they should deem it expedient to require explanation from him on the subject of it, he will be at all times ready to afford such explanations; and he will moreover, most willingly supply any further information they may desire to have, to the utmost extent compatible with his duty to His Sovereign.

His Excellency's Messages of the 23d and 25th inst. relating to the financial affairs of the Province, and the preceding answer to the Address, was referred to the Committee on the Estimate.

On motion of Mr. Neilson, the House resolved, to take into consideration the state of the Province, in a committee of the whole House on the 8th March.

UPPER CANADA. The committee on the Welland Canal have made a report, accompanied by a Bill to authorize Government to issue debentures for £200,000 to pay off the debt contracted in England, to complete the Canal by the Grand River, &c. The Bill has been referred to the Committee on Supply.

St. JOHN—The Brig America, from Patagonia, to New Bedford, having 20 000 seal skins, and 1000 barrels of Sperm oil on board, was wrecked on the 14th of Feb. supposed to be 33 leagues from the S. W. part of Bermuda. She was sailing with S. E.

breeze, when a violent N. W. wind struck her aback, the rigging was immediately cut away, the mast went over, and she filled with water. All the crew 34 in number except the Master and Mate, were washed overboard, and perished. They two were washed overboard, but the topsail halyard's caught the mate's feet, which he afterwards caught hold of—and seized the master, and saved him also. They were two days on the wreck, and were taken off by the schr. Caledonia, of Yarmouth, N. S. from St. Thomas'. On the afternoon of the same day, the 'C' fell in with the Laurel, of Alexandria, bound to Bermuda, and the master, John Parker, went on board of her. The mate, William Canfield, was landed at Yarmouth, on the 26th ult. and this morning arrived here in the packet from Digby.

United States.

General Jackson has, in answer to a requisition from several Members of the Legislature of Pennsylvania, signified his willingness of again offering himself as a candidate for the Presidency.

The Committee of the House of Representatives, to whom was referred so much of the President's Message as relates to the present Tariff of Duties on Imports, concludes a very lengthy report by stating, that "that they believe that the Tariff, having been so recently revised, any attempt to change its provisions at this time, would spread alarm among the great interests of the country, shake confidence in the plighted faith of government, destroy the supposed well-founded hopes of millions of their fellow citizens, reduce them to penury, and expose the whole country to the dangers of a most selfish policy, which might be adopted by foreign nations."

The report was laid on the table, and 6,000 copies of it ordered to be printed.

To supply this deficiency, by forming a local as well as commercial intimacy, is the primary consideration of the author.
