

Provincial Act for the registry of Marriages within this Province; but for reasons unknown to your Petitioners, such Bills have not been concurred in by the other Branch of the Legislature.

Your Majesty's faithful Commons being fully persuaded of the firm attachment and loyalty to Your Majesty's Person and Government, of that portion of Your Majesty's subjects for whom they now most humbly entreat Your Majesty's Royal favour, pray Your Majesty to take their case into favourable consideration, and that Your Majesty will be pleased graciously to give instructions to the Administrator of the Government, to recommend the Legislature to pass such Bill as he may deem proper to obtain Your Majesty's Royal sanction, for the purpose of extending the privileges of celebrating and solemnizing Marriage to the regularly ordained and settled Clergy of Dissenting Congregations in Your Majesty's Province of New-Brunswick, or otherwise, as Your Majesty, in your Royal Wisdom may deem meet.

And, as in duty bound, will ever pray.

The Legislature of this Province was Prorogued on Thursday, the 31st ult. The following Speech was delivered by His Honor the President, on the occasion.

Mr. President, and Gentlemen of the Council.

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the Assembly.

Having had the satisfaction of assenting to all the bills you have passed, many of which, by their wise and salutary provisions, must prove of primary importance and benefit to the Province, it now becomes my agreeable duty, at closing the present Session, to express to you my best acknowledgements for your ready and diligent attention to the several objects recommended to your consideration; and to thank you in His Majesty's name, for the liberal grants you have made for the services of the current year.

WEST INDIES. PIRACY AND MURDER.—

The St. Thomas Times contains a shocking account of a Piracy and Murder, said to be committed near the Island of St. Domingo; a vessel having been fallen in with near the latter Island, with a great number of murdered persons on board. The vessel is supposed to be the one which has for some time been employed in bearing an Equestrian corpse among the West India Islands; and the murdered persons are believed to be the unfortunate beings who composed that corpse. The large sum of money which these people are said to have accumulated induces a belief in the horriblerumour; some of the pirates must have kept a sharp look out on them—tracked the vessel on her route, and plundered and murdered all on board.

The election to the Popedom has fallen on Cardinal Mauro Capellari, et. 65, the Prefect of the Congregation de Propaganda Fide. He has taken the title of Gregory XVI., probably in honor of Gregory XV, who was the founder of the abovesaid congregation. Gregory XV. died in 1623.—Falmouth Packet.
