We have been obligingly favored with the following extracts from two letters received from the Magdalen Islands:

June 19.—The brig Traveller, Pierson, ran ashore on the North pond, on the 15th inst. about 12 o'clock M. in a thick fog, while going at the rate of two knots. Mr Munsey having sent to her assistance all the men in his employ, they succeeded in getting her off again, by throwing over her deck load. About 11 or 12 o'clock the next night, they were forced to slip the chain and leave it with the anchor.

The Brig Caledonia, Captain Auld, from the Baie de Chaleur, lumber loaded, ran ashore on the East side of the Island, on the 17th inst. and there are no hopes of her getting off again.
