ST. JOHN'S, N. F. May 5: It is our paidful duty to record a most distressing shipwreck, attended with the metaneholy loss of lifes, which occurred on the evening of Friday, 22d. inst. The schr. Hope, Mullowney, mas-ter, belonging to Carbonear, an her return from a scaling voyage, with 3,500 scale, while lying-to in a heavy gale on the above even-ning, struck on a rock near one of the Wadham Islands, and alning, struck on a rock mear one of the Wadham Islands, and al-most immediately went to pieces, when the whole crew of 25 men, (with the exception of one man who had been sent aloft to loose the topsail, to endeavor to clear the land) pershed: This poor fellow, named Froud, remained on the wreck of the mast till the following Sunday, when he swam on shore, and having previden-tially discovered a keg of powder, belonging to the vessel not whol-ly damaged, he succeeded in making a fire which attracted the notice of a passing schooler bound to this pert, the Elizabeth, W. Dwyer, master, of Tilten Harbour, who launched a boat and took him on beard, much bruised; and exhausted. He arrived here on Saturday last, and it gives us satisfactied to add, that the crew of the Elizabeth made up a handsome sum amongst them for his re-lief.
