

An Act to enable the Justices of the Peace for the County of Kent, to raise money by assessment on the Inhabitants of the said County, to discharge the Debt due for erecting the Court House and Gaol.

Passed 31st March, 1831.

Whereas the Justice of the General Sessions of the Peace for the County of Kent have levied the whole sum they were empowered to raise by assessment, for the erection and finishing of a Gaol and Court House; and whereas the same has been found insufficient to discharge the amount of the contract for completing the same:

Be it therefore enacted by the President, Council, and Assembly, That the Justices of the Peace for the said County, at any General Sessions of the Peace hereafter to be holden, be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to make such further rate and assessment not exceeding three hundred and fifty pounds as they in their discretion may think necessary for the purpose of paying off the debt due for the erection and completing of the said Court House and Gaol, the said sum or sums to be levied, assessed, collected and paid under and by virtue of any act or acts, that are now or hereafter may be in force in this Province, for assessing, levying, and collecting of rates for public charges.
