tance of its being resorted to by the Moose. The water has a peculiar taste, and when drank produced frequent eruptions strongly impregnated with sculpher, from which circumstance it obtained the name of the "GUNPOWDER SPRING." In that early day, it was considered merely as a curiosity, and we are not aware that any pains have since been taken, to ascertain what peculiar qualities it possesses. One object in this article is to draw attention to it.—The Gunpowder Spring, is a few miles from Nashwalk on the portage to Miramichi river; and unless within late years the course of the road has been altered, it is close by the side of the portage road. The Spring was well known by many of the Nashwalk settlers, and no doubt there are many there now who can point out the spot. With very little trouble some of the water might be taken to Fredericton, and analysed there.

On Saturday night last, about 4000 tons of Timber, in rafts, broke loose (it is supposed from not having been properly secured) from Misquito Cove, above Indian Town, of which about half found its way through the falls, and on Sunday morning great quantities of logs were drifting about the harbour, a considerable portion of which was picked up—it is thought, however, that from 600 to 800 tons have been lost.

CHARLOTTE-TOWN, P. E. Island.—Flogging made easy.—Four sailors, belonging to the barque Quebec Trader, of Dublin, were last week sentenced by the Supreme Court, to receive twenty lashes each, for stealing a keg of tobacco from a vessel discharging at the wharf, which tobacco they afterwards divided among themselves in equal shares on board their own vessel—a sentence in all conscience mild enough for an offence amounting to grand larceny, and which rendered them subject to a much severer punishment. And by whom think ye, gentle reader, was the punishment inflicted?—By the hands of the parties themselves!! That is, in plain English, they were allowed to flog each other. The whole affair went off with the most perfect good humour, and without the slightest contortion of countenance being exhibited on the occasion. This exhibition actually took place at the market house, on Saturday last, and we make no doubt will be attended with the best consequences. Who will now dare to lay hands upon his neighbour's property?—Who will now presume to say that the vengeance of the law is a mere bugbear! Truly we live in rare times.—Gazette.

AT. ANDREWS.—Western Seal Island.—We are gratified to learn that the Commissioners appointed to examine and report upon the expediency of building a LIGHT-HOUSE on this Island have attended to that duty, and (though nothing of an official character has transpired) think favourably of the situation for that purpose. We have never had but one opinion upon this important subject, and should the measure be carried into effect, will have pleasure in reflecting that we first brought it under the consideration of the Legislature, from a conviction that the navigation of the Province would be greatly benefitted thereby, and in all probability many valuable lives and much property rescued from destruction.

The late Captain James Reid, of St. John, who had as much experience and thorough knowledge of the bay as any person in the Province, and Captain Scott of Fredericton, were decidedly favourable to the contemplated LIGHT.
