

to myself, to make an application to the other Trustee, (who is assuredly a gentleman in every sense of the word,) for the calling of a general meeting; and he personally informed me that he knew but of two complainants, and that for his part he should certainly defer to the opinion of the public. At his desire I again spoke to the Trustee who has acted as my accuser, stating to him the opinion of his colleague. That gentleman felt himself exceedingly aggrieved that any person should interfere with him in the management of his own school, particularly as an occurrence had taken place in the school, near the residence of that individual, in which he had suffered him to legislate as he thought fit. He then informed me that he should dispense with the opinion of the inhabitants altogether, as he was prepared to prove my incompetency from his own observations.

The following day, the 6th May, that gentleman again called at the School, and commenced another close examination of the writing of the pupils, openly declared his reprobation of the most minute errors and omissions, and indeed seemed resolved on discovering faults for the purpose of censuring me in the presence of the whole school.

I have now, Sir, nearly completed the third year of my superintendence of this school, and as the best proof of the reputation to which I have raised it, I beg leave to state that the return made to the Sessions, about the middle of the first year, according to Law, comprised forty-three scholars; the following year it amounted to forty-eight, and the present year to seventy-three; exhibiting an increase in one year of twenty-five, and in two years of thirty.

I have only to add, that being informed by a gentleman, whose veracity and conduct should be an example for all, that a general accusation had been lodged against me, and to have ascertained that that assertion was untrue, and that consequently that gentleman must be actuated by motives which good Christians ought not to entertain, has excited astonishment in my breast, in a degree which I leave a generous public to appreciate.
