SCHEDIASMA.

MIRAMICHI:

TUESDAY MORNING, FEBRUARY 22, 1831.

A correspondent at Richibucto informs us, that the Courier from Dorchester arrived there last week, in 13 hours and 3-4 within his time. The Courier arrived here on Saturday evening, about half past six o'clock.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.—We have been favoured with the Journals of the House up to the 14th inst. and we are happy to perceive that the business of the session, retarded at the outset, by the difficulty of choosing a Speaker, is now progressing in that cordial and amicable manner, which has hitherto characterised the proceedings of our Legislature.

The St John papers contain the debates of the house up to the 9th. We have commenced copying the same this week, and shall continue to do so every week, until the business of the session be brought to a close.

SUMMARY OF THE PROCEEDINGS.—February 10.—Mr Weldon presented a petition praying pecuniary aid to assist in the discharge of the debt due for building the Court House and Gaol in Kent County. Referred to a committee of supply. Mr W moved for leave to bring in a bill to authorize the Justices of the Peace for the county of Kent, to assess the Inhabitants for the purpose of paying off the debt due for building the Court House and Gaol. Leave granted, and the bill was read a first time. Mr W. by leave, presented a petition from Wm Hannington, Jun, praying compensation for having completed an Oat Mill and Kiln, at Cocagne,—referred to the committee of supply.

February 11 Mr Cunard by leave, presented a petition from Joseph Russell and others, Members of the Chatham Fire Engine Company, praying that as such, they may be relieved from serving on Juries as well as from Militia duty. Received. Mr C by leave, presented a petition from Joseph and Samuel, praying return of duty on wine, twice paid by them. Upon the question that the petition be received, it was decided in the negative. On motion of Mr Cunard, Resolved, that a committee be appointed to prepare a bill to regulate the duties of Fire Wards, Fire Engine Men, and to authorise the Justices in the respective Counties, in General Sessions, to assess for the expense of Engines; and such other expenses as may be necessarily incurred, to guard against or extinguish fires, and to repeal all Acts now in force relating thereto. Ordered that Messrs. Cunard, Humbert, Slason, Hill, and Simonds, be a committee therefor.

February 14—Mr Cunard moved for leave to bring in a bill to regulate the Salmon Fishery in the County of Northumberland, and to repeal the laws now in force relative to the same, as far as they relate to the said county of Northumberland. The bill was read a first time.

WESLEYAN MISSIONS.—A meeting will be held at the Wesleyan Preaching Room, Chatham, on Monday evening, the 28th inst. and also in the Wesleyan Chapel, Newcastle, on Tuesday evening, the 1st March, for the purpose of forming a Wesleyan Missionary Branch Society, for the Miramichi Circuit. The chair to be taken at 7 o'clock, at each place.

Preparatory Sermons will be preached on the Sunday preceding. The services to commence at Chatham at half past 2 o'clock, in the afternoon, and 6 o'clock in the evening; and at Newcastle at 11 o'clock in the morning, and 6 o'clock in the evening.

Collections will be taken up at the close of each service, in aid of the funds of the above Institution.

We have copied in our first page a long extract from a work lately published, entitled 'A Tour in Prussia and Poland, by R. Smith,' which gives an account of the Capital of the latter country, which we have no doubt will be read with interest at the present crisis of affairs in Poland.

The Halifax papers contain the Petition of the Chamber of Commerce at that place, to Lord Goderich Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, praying that the present duty on foreign timber imported into the mother country may be continued. The Petition is couched in strong and energetic language, and develops many of the evils likely to result to Great Britain, as well as the Colonies, if such a ruinous, and impolitic measure be carried into effect.

QUEBEC.—It is with pleasure we announce the continued improvement in the health of His Excellency Lord Aylmer. His Lordship this day received the Assembly, with their Addresses in Answer to his Speech at the opening of the Legislature.

Whatever Financial Differences have agitated the Legislature of this Province, a defective Revenue, at least, forms no part of the difficulties. Speaking in round numbers, the gross revenue may be stated at £162,000 over that of 1829, which again exceeded the antecedent year by £20,000. This is pretty good evidence of the rising importance of this Province, to whose prosperity the *Tare and Trell* politicians, recently brought into power, would lay the ax, to benefit the inhabitants of Foreign States, by the utter ruin of this extensive British Colony.

EXPULSION OF THE MEMBER FOR GASPE.—It will be seen by reference to the summary of Parliamentary proceedings, that Mr. Christie, the member returned for Gaspé was, last night, for the third time, expelled the House.

We recommended the arguments used by the several gentlemen who spoke on the occasion to the serious attention of our readers, who are capable of forming their own judgement upon this renewed, proceeding in the present Provincial Parliament. It will be seen by referring to the list of votes, that Mr. Christie was supported by some of the most respectable and talented members of the House.

ST. ANDREWS.—During the past year there has been committed to the Common Goal in Charlotte County, on Magistrates' warrants, for Debt alone, 50 persons—the aggregate of the whole amounting to the sum of £122 2s 9d. one of which number was for the trifling sum of 6s. 8d.—Only two of these took the benefit of the Insolvent Debtor's Act, and were released in thirty days from the date of their imprisonment.
