

received.—Austria has formerly recognised the neutrality of Switzerland.—It is stated in the Calcutta papers of the 19th of November, that the Rajah of Buxar, and another person of local influence, had presented to the Governor-General an address of thanks for the suppression of suttees. The address bore the signatures of all the principal natives of the district.—It is intended again to separate the West India from the Halifax command. Rear Admiral Lord James O'Brien will hoist his flag as Commander-in-Chief on the North American station.—Government have stipulated for the building of six new steamers of 500 tons each, to be built in private yards, by contract.—The election for a Representative in Parliament for the city of Londonderry has terminated in the return of Sir Robert Ferguson.—Greenwich Hospital is, for the future, to be open to merchant seamen as well as to the King's.

THE REFORM BILL.—The opinion seems now to be pretty general, that ministers will be able to carry the reform bill without a dissolution of Parliament. At least, we believe, it may be taken for granted, that there will be no dissolution, unless they should be outvoted in some important clause in the committee. His Majesty, we learn, although very much beset by members of his own family, (the princesses, it is understood, are decided anti-reformers,) is quite firm, and thoroughly identified with his ministers in support of the bill. Nevertheless, we have heard, from a quarter in which we are disposed to rely, that it is in compliance with his wishes that the measure of a dissolution has not been resorted to.

PORT OF PICTOU, N. S.

The wrecks of two Shallops, belonging to the Magdalen Islands, and out on a Sothing voyage, have lately been discovered on the Island of Anticosti, supposed cast away in the gale on the 9th April. The crew of one of these, seven in number, it is to be feared have perished. That of the other, there is every reason to hope is saved; for we learn that the names of the master, Andrew Doyle and six others, were found inscribed on a board, conspicuously stuck up at some distance from the shore. Another Sealer owned in the same quarter, as also a Shallop belonging to Cheticamp, out in the same gale, have not been heard of. These melancholy tidings will carry distress and sorrow to the dwellings of many, for the sufferers are all said to have been married men, who have left large families to lament their loss.
