At a General Session of the Peace held at Newcastle in the County of Northumberland, August 1832.

WHEREAS it appears that some of the Licenced Auctioneers, in this County, have neglected to pay to the County Treasurer the amount required by order of a Session made pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly of this Province, entitled an Act for the better regulation of Sales by Auction.

THEREFORE ordered that all Auctioneers residing within the County of Northumberland, who shall neglect to pay into the hands of the County Treasurer all arrears due from the respectively, before the first day of the next March Session, be proceeded against by the County Treasurer as the Law directs.
