At a General Session of the Peace held at Newcastle, in and for the County of Northumberland, on Thursday the Twentieth day of March, in the Year of our Lord 1832.

ORDERED, That no Horse, Mare, or Gelding, be allowed to run or go at large in the parishes of Newcastle, Chatham, Nelson, Northesk, or Blackville: at any time between the fifteenth day of May, and the fifteenth day of October, during the continuance of this Regulation, under the penalty of five shillings, to be paid by the owner of any Horse, Mare, or Gelding found going at large, for each time such Horse, Mare or Gelding shall be found going at large, in either of the said parishes, in violation of this order. And it is further Ordered, That the Hogsreaves in the respective parishes above mentioned, do take up and impound any Horse, Mare or Gelding, found going at large contrary to this regulation, and that they shall be entitled to demand and receive the sum of five shillings, for each Horse, Mare or Gelding so taken up and impounded, to be paid, together with charges of the Pound-keeper, before such beast is delivered from the Pound.
