TUESDAY MORNING, JUNE 26, 1832.

By the arrival of the ship Frederick, from Liverpool, at St. John, we are enabled to lay before our readers London dates to the 15th, and Liverpool to the 16th May, which furnishes us with the highly important information of the resignation of the Grey Administration, and that His Grace the Duke of Wellington, has been requested by His Majesty to form a New Ministry. We have published this extra sheet to enable us to furnish our readers with the opinions of the various Public Journals upon the probable result of this measure. It is highly satisfactory to perceive, that up to the latest dates, no intention was manifested on the part of the people in London, or in several of the large Manufacturing Districts, to commit the slightest depredations, but fears were entertained that such would ultimately be the case, accommodations were being prepared for a large body of troops in the metropolis.

On Tuesday last, after our paper was delivered in the settlements, the Steamer, Royal William, arrived from Quebec, and reported the highly important, and very melancholy information, that the ASIATIC CHOLERA made its appearance in that City on the 8th inst., and up to 8 o'clock on the morning of the 15th, One Hundred and Sixty-One persons, had fallen victims to its ravages. We immediately struck off a small slip, containing the above tidings, which we forwarded by the mail, and caused the same to circulate among our subscribers in Miramichi. The boat was not allowed to hold any other intercourse with the shore than to land a few letters, and was ordered immediately to the quarantine station, where she was boarded by Dr. Key, one of the Health Officers, who was informed by the Captain, that a short time after their departure from Quebec, the Carpenter, with another of the crew, was seized with a disease, corresponding in symptoms, with Cholera; since that time four more of the crew, including the engineer, have been attacked with the same disorder. Her steerage passengers, amounting to fifty, were landed on Sheldrake Island, on Saturday last, together with the sick, who are now occupying the buildings recently erected on the Island as Lazar Houses. The Captain with the cabin passengers, remain on board the vessel, with such of the crew as continue healthy. From the precautionary measures adopted by the Board of Health, we feel confident the infection will be confined to the Island, and we are glad to perceive that this opinion prevails among the inhabitants, who apprehend not the slightest danger of the spreading of the disease.

We have thus been particular in stating the simple facts of the case, being aware, there are individuals among us, as in all communities, continually upon the stretch for novelties—ready to make the most of LITTLE—and anxious to communicate the same to their friends at a distance—who, kind souls, in the superabundance of their liberality—communicate the same to some one of our brethren of the PRESS—a body, than whom none more anxious to spread tales of the marvellous, can be found in Christendom—who willingly commit the same to the columns of their miscellany; none of the parties for a moment considering the baneful effects such reports may have upon the trade and commerce of a country. The Board of Health, impressed with similar views, issued a circular on Thursday, for the purpose of removing all erroneous impressions—to establish a proper confidence, and to allay the natural apprehensions of the inhabitants; and it is their intention to issue similar documents at short intervals.

Much credit is due the Magistrates, for the prompt measures they have adopted during the season, to enforce the quarantine regulations; but while we are bestowing the meed of just approbation to that body in this County, we are sorry to remark, that we learn these salutary restrictions have been most slovenly enforced in a neighbouring port. We understand, it not unfrequently occurs, that when a vessel is boarded by the Health Officer, that individual meets in her cabin a number of persons from the shore. If any of the inhabitants are so thoughtless, and so inconsiderate, as to place their own lives, as well as their relatives and neighbours in jeopardy, by a breach of the laws of the lands, it behoves those placed in authority, to exact the penalties. We make these remarks, in hopes they will meet with attention in the proper quarter. Our Magistrates, have most laudably exerted themselves to enforce the sanitary regulations of quarantine; but their services will be rendered of little avail, if disease is allowed, through carelessness, to be introduced into a neighbouring port, without all intercourse by land is interrupted.

THE Royal William, steamer, arrived from Quebec, on Tuesday evening last. The Committee are sorry to inform the public, that from the Report of the Health Officers, no doubt existed that several of the Crew were then labouring under a Disease, strongly resembling the Cholera, now prevailing in that place. In consequence, the vessel has been ordered into Quarantine, at Sheldrake Island; the sick are all landed, and up to last night no Death had occurred, and altho' some new cases had appeared since her arrival, none are reported for the last two days. The Committee therefore hope, that the measures adopted, will effectually prevent this disease from being communicated to our shores.

The situation having been offered to the Duke of Wellington, who, after some delay, had declined the acceptance, stating that he had found it impossible to form a Ministry; the event giving the highest satisfaction to His Majesty and the nation at large.

The news only reached Greenock BY EXPRESS, a few hours prior to the sailing of the Warrior, which prevented Mr S. obtaining a paper, but he pledges himself for the accuracy of the above intelligence.
