Europe, where the climate is more equable, except [in the northern parts of that continent,] where the dispo-sition to billious habits is greater There is, however, no reason to suppose that a common evil, will not be borne here with as much resignation as elsewhere, and that the most rigorous measures of protection will not be taken. It is every body's duty, under such a dis-pensation, to be most vigilant in aiding in the common cause. Cleanliness about houses, and about the per-son, temperance in drinking, the moderate use of same food, regularity of all habits, no excesses of any kind of warm cloathing, and perhaps above all a manful determination to meet the worst, and indeed a kind of beed-lessness about the disease, are the most useful preventatives.

4 o'clock, P. M. Monday, 11th June.—The Board of Health has not yet issued a Report. It is uncertain if they will do so to-day, the Returns from private bouses not having all been made. We believe the following is a pretty correct statement of the deaths. cases, &c. up to noon to-day.

AT PRIVATE DWELLINGS.

Estimated at 20 cases-15 deaths.

Total deaths 41, in the last three days. Of these about 7 deaths only had occurred up to noon on Saturday, the remaining 34 deaths had occurred in the last 48 hours.

The greater number of cases have come from Champlain street. But five to eight deaths are known to have taken place in St Rock's, some in the Cul de Sac and St. Peter street. Three or four in the Upper Town and St. John's Suburbs.

Death has been caused in five to six hours. The dead are not carried to the chunches. The Catholics are deposited in the new burying ground outside St. John's suburbs.

No building for the sick is yet provided in the Low-er Town. Enormous rents have been asked Some persons have mentioned the King's Stores, Kung's
