

EXTRACTS FROM THE JOURNALS.

February 4.—Mr Simonds, pursuant to notice given, brought under consideration of the House, the subject relative to the Casual Revenue, and submitted the two following Resolutions:

Resolved, That a humble Address be presented to his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, praying that his Excellency will be pleased to direct to be laid before the house, an account of monies received by all persons employed in collecting the Casual and other Crown Revenues, between the 1st day of January 1830, and 31st day of December, 1831, inclusive, shewing the amount of each branch of such Revenues, and the charges for collecting the same; and also a detailed account of the application of such Revenues within the said periods, and the amount remaining unapplied on the 1st day of January 1832.

Resolved, that an humble Address be presented to his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, praying that his Excellency will be pleased to direct to be laid before this house, a statement of the amount of the incomes of all the officers in the Civil departments of the Province, whether derived from salaries, commissions, or fees, or from any other source; distinguishing the amount of each branch of income.

The Resolutions were severally read, when an amendment was moved to the first of the said Resolutions to be added thereto, viz:

"In order that this house may have it in their power to lay before his Majesty such a petition respecting the same as shall be grounded on correct and proper premises."

Upon the question for adopting the said amendment, the house divided: Yeas, 18. Nays, 8.

February 7. Mr Simonds from the Committee appointed to present the Address of this House of the 4th inst. to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, requesting information respecting the receipts and expenditure of the Casual and other Crown Revenues, reported that they had presented the said address, and his Excellency was pleased to make the following reply:

"Gentlemen,—In answer to this address, praying for an account of all monies received by all persons employed in collecting the Casual and other Crown Revenues, between the 1st day of Jan. 1830 and the 31st day of December, 1831; I have only to express my regret, that with Lord Goderich's Despatch on the subject of his Majesty's Casual Revenue before it, the house should have placed me under the necessity of declining to comply with its request."

Mr Simonds from the Committee appointed to present another Address of this house of the 4th inst. to his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, requesting that an account of the incomes of all officers in the Civil Departments in the Province may be laid before this house, reported, that they had presented the said address, and that his Excellency was pleased to make the following reply:

"Gentlemen,—In answer to this address, praying for a statement of the amount of the incomes of all the officers in the civil departments in the Province, &c.; I have to observe, that the subject of it is so closely connected with that of the Address, to which I have just replied, that I am again under the necessity of declining to acquiesce in the wishes of the house."

February 9. Read a second time, the following Bills:—To enable the Minister, Elders, and Committee, for the time being, of the Church in connexion with the Presbyterian Church in Nova-Scotia to erect in the Town of Chatham, to hold the same, to them and their successors for ever, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

A Bill to alter and amend the Laws now in force for the establishment, regulation, and improvement of the Great Roads of communication through the Province.

A Bill subjecting real estates in the Province of New-Brunswick to the payment of Debts, and directing the Sheriff in his proceedings thereon; and

A Bill to amend an Act passed in the first year of His present Majesty's Reign intitled "An Act to repeal the Acts now in force regulating the exportation of Lumber and to make other provisions in lieu thereof."

February 10. Mr Taylor, by leave, presented a petition from the Rev. William G. Johnstone, and others, protestants, professing the doctrine of the Church of Scotland, which was read; setting forth:—That the petitioners perceive by the Journals of the House of Assembly, that a Bill to extend the privilege of solemnizing Marriage to settled and ordained ministers of dissenting congregations in this Province, is now under the consideration of the house; and that they are desirous that the privilege of solemnizing Marriage should be extended to all ordained, and settled Ministers of Christian congregations within the Province, in as full and ample a manner as is now enjoyed by any clergyman or minister in connexion with the established churches of Great-Britain; that the petitioners understand that it is in contemplation to insert a clause in the above-mentioned bill, which will affect the usages, and limit the privileges of the church, to which they belong; and beg leave respectfully to submit, that such a measure, if carried into effect, would be an interference with the powers and authority of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, and an infringement of its rights and privileges, as by law established; and they humbly conceive it will not, in any instance, be the desire of the Legislature of New-Brunswick, so distinguished for its liberality, to deprive any of his Majesty's subjects, in this Province, of those rights which they have hitherto enjoyed, and do at present possess, unless the possession of those rights should have been perverted to the hurt or injury of the community; and as no such charge has ever been made against the ministers in this Province, in connexion with the Church of Scotland, they confidently hope that no clause will be inserted in the said bill which will go to affect the usages, or limit the privileges of the petitioners; but should any such charge be made, they feel assured that the House of Assembly will never refuse to grant time and opportunity to disprove the same, which they will always be prepared to do, as they are confident that no such charge can have any foundation in fact; they, therefore, humbly pray, that the Legislature may pass a bill which will extend the privilege of solemnizing marriage to all ordained and settled ministers of all

On motion of Mr Rankin, Whereas it appears that the present laws of Quarantine in this Province are not sufficient to ensure the desired object:—Therefore resolved, that a committee be appointed, consisting of one member from the City of St. John, and the several counties of Charlotte, Westmorland, Gloucester, Kent, and Northumberland, to examine the said Laws of Quarantine, and that they shall forthwith submit to this house, such amendments and alterations in the said laws, as they shall consider expedient and necessary to guard against the approach of disease. Ordered, that Messrs. Rankin, Kinnear, Wyer, Smith, End, and Weldon, be a Committee therefor.

February 11. Mr Rankin, by leave, presented four several petitions from Alexander McDonald, and eighty others, Alexander Davidson, and sixty one others, Robert Leslie, and forty-six others, Donald McKay, and forty-three others, freeholders and inhabitants of the County of Northumberland, praying that no act may pass this session of the Legislature, for regulating the Salmon Fishery in the said county, which he severally read. Ordered, that the said petitions be received, and lie on the table.

Read a third time as engrossed, A Bill to incorporate certain persons Pewholders of St. Andrew's Church, in the Parish of Chatham, in the County of Northumberland, in connection with the Establish; ed Church of Scotland. Resolved, that the bill do pass.

On motion of Mr Allen, Resolved, that a Committee be appointed to prepare an Address to Sir Howard Douglas, expressive of the sense which this house entertain of his distinguished exertions in advocating the Commercial interests of the Province of New-Brunswick. Ordered, that Messrs. Simonds, Rankin, and Partelow, be a committee to prepare the address.
