3. That any person cutting a hole or holes in the ice for the b. This shy period that is a very green bushes firmly in the ice round each hole, at equal distances, not less than ten feet high, with the branches and leaves on, so as to be plainly and readily seen, and secure the same so that they will remain standing, at all times while the said hole or holes continue open, or the ice

4. That any person or persons cutting a hole in the tee, for the purpose of fishing, shall not be interrupted by any other per-son cutting a hole for the like purpose within the distance of 30 fathems of the hole first cut as aforesaid.

That no set nets shall be allowed, set, or put down, for 5. the purpose of taking Pass, during the winter season, or the Rivers remain frozen:

6. That any person infringing or violating any of the fore-geing rules, shall be liable to the penalty of Three Pounds for each and every offence, to be recovered and applied according to Law.
