They seem to have lost their teader (which lke birds and bees, they undonbtedly have) when they are found at sea Voyages over land constitude, it is presumable, their natural sphere. They are by no means to be welcomed any wherefirms of the ocean: for there are certain accompaniaments always tound with them, which renders their presence an evil, and their absence a blessing devoutly

We perceive by the Patriot, that the locusts have also appeared in Baltimore.
