

'most melancholy,' in their peevish and discontented singing; and the associations connected with their approach, are ominous and unpleasant. They remind us of the time when they came to Egypt—'When the morning came, the east wind brought the locusts,' and their warping clouds

'Above the realms of impious Pharaoh, hung
Lake night, and darkened all the land of Nile.'

The rapidity with which those insects traverse vast sections of country, is truly astonishing. Many sea captains have found them in dark heavy swarms, at the distance of one or two hundred miles from the shores of Africa and Asia. They seem to have lost their leader (which like birds and bees, they undoubtedly have) when they are found at sea. Voyages over land constitute, it is presumable, their natural sphere. They are by no means to be welcomed anywhere—on terra firma or the ocean: for there are certain accompaniments always found with them, which renders their presence an evil, and their absence a blessing devoutly to be wished.

We perceive by the Patriot, that the locusts have also appeared in Baltimore.

BOARD OF HEALTH.

MIRAMICHI, June 9, 1834.

ORDERED, That no Emigrants arriving from any Port or Place in Great-Britain and Ireland, in the Counties of Kent or Gloucester, and shall leave those places to come to Miramichi, shall be allowed to proceed further from Gloucester towards Miramichi, than *Forein's*, so called, without having a certificate from the Health Officer at Bathurst, of their healthy state: and that those coming from Richibucto to Miramichi shall not be allowed to proceed further from Richibucto towards Miramichi than *John Quin's*, on the Richibucto Road, without having a certificate from the Health Officer at Richibucto of their Healthy state, under the penalty of *Thirty Shillings* each, for each offence—to be recovered as the Law directs; and shall also be liable to be sent back from whence they came.
