MR EDITOR,

As I fear your friend Larry Wagstaff's description of our settlement may fall into the hands of some of my distant countrymen, and tend to mislead them, as Larry, though a good natured fellow, and a queer fish, is often incorrect, as I shall shortly demonstrate, and by way of supplying some more correct information on the subject, I beg to present thro' your journal, a full, true, and particular account of the sad disasters that I went through, during one day's

EXCURSION IN MIRAMICHI.

Well, to begin, I am a canny Scotsman, residing in Chatham, and not being sensible enough to belong to the Tea-totellers, I sallied out one morning, in quest of my bitters, and in the way of looking out for a Tavern, guess my astonishment when the first one I came to contained nothing but Stacks! On I went, with no better luck, for in the next, instead of a pretty, smiling barmaid, what should I find, busy floundering among the kegs of 'spirited liquors,' but a fine, stout looking Pike. There was a fish for you Larry, worth looking at, and none of your Spratts. But in my travels up street, it appeared to me, that fish could not be a scarce commodity, as for a considerable distance the trade seems to be supplying the natives with fresh soles. One one side of the street I saw some Nice-bits, though right across always Rainie. It would have been as well had I terminated my rable with a Finis, for after being at the trouble to pass several Lane's, one of them a very broad one, I entered a blacksmith's shop, where I only saw some bundles of Hay. I now put about, and had Larry been in my company down the busy road, colours would not have been scanty with him, for I saw T Green, and different samples of Grey. I saw people from various countries, and among others a number of Scots, a few English, but no Irish, and one funny looking Norman.

Larry complains of having no horse shoes, nor harness. Strange! I saw a number of both Smiths and Saddlers, and for fish Callar Haddock, of different sizes. On nearing the Ship-Yard, I met with what has often tormented many a good fellow in his ebbing fortunes, a goodly number of Duns. The Ship-yard seems to be a sorry place for my countrymen, for I saw Bruce pulling away at the end of a whip saw. Wallace was once there too, but he's gone, nobody knows where. I saw three fine clear looking Wells, besides the one from which they took their rise. Most of the young fellows about the yard look healthy. Why should they not—for they get their grub served out to them three times a day by the Peck. Further along I met a lady with her Arch bald, and other with her head all Combie. I went no further that way, for fear of getting entangled among Forests—and as I came up finding it a little Rainie, I determined to cross the river. I was ferried over by an Oxford man, but finding it still Rainie above, I thought of going down along; from this I was prevented by an Edge-er, warning me that if I went that way, I would fall in with sundry dens of Lyons before I came to one Good-fellow to assist me.

Misfortune, however, still attended me, for about a mile further on my road to Newcastle, as I was looking at a neat little brown Jessamine, and expecting to see some good Porter, or a little stingo in Chambers, who should come up-but a big Wheeler, who tumbled me into a Wright's waggon, intending me as a present for his friend Grimley. And now was the time, Larry my boy, if you wanted to see big fish, for of a truth we were nearly capsized over two enormous Bass! black they were as crows, and we were told there were some small fry of the same species, and more expected. Our next encounter was with a Weight, but of how many pounds and ounces we did not ascertain, and that weight was fondling some young Wolfs. We then passed a very queer place, the only inhabitants being Herons, and some lots of Hey, defended by a formidable looking Horn, me-
