QUARANTINE REGULATION.

AT a Special Sessions of the Peace, held at the Court House, in Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, on Wednesday, the Eleventh day of May, 1842, convened for the purpose of making Rules and Regulations for the better preventing the importation or spreading of infectious Distempers:

PRESENT: John Nesmith, H. B. Allison. J. T. Williston, Esquires, William Letson, Justices. P. Williston, H. C. D. Carman,

Whereas by the first Section of an Act made and passed in the 39th year of the reign of His Majesty George the Third, entitled "an Act to prevent the importation or spreading of Infectious Distempers within this Province," it is enacted that no Master Mariner or Passenger whatsoever, belonging to or coming in any British vessel, or in any vessel owned in the United States of Amercia, from any port or place where the yellow fever, putrid bilious fever, or other pestilential or contagious distemper does prevail, shall land within the limits of any county in this Province, without permission first had and obtained in writing under the hand and seal of one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for such County, under the penalty of ten pounds for each and every person so landing without a written permission as aforesaid.

And whereas it is enacted by the Fifth Section of the said Act "That it shall and may be lawful for the Justices of the Peace in the respective Counties at their General Sessions, or at any special Sessions to be called for the purpose, to make such further rules and regulations in aid of the present act, for the better preventing the importation or spreading of such infectious distempers, with such pains and penalties not exceeding ten pounds, for each and every offence against such rules and regulations as to them may seem meet:'

It is therefore Ordered, That the master or commander of every vessel having on board the Small Pox, Yellow Fever, Putrid Bilious Fever, or any other pestilential or contagious distemper, or coming from any place infected with any such distempers, or at which any such distemper at the time of her departure were known or supposed to prevail, or on board of which vessel any person during the voyage had died, or been sick of any such distemper; shall immediately after her arrival within Fox Island in the Bay of Miramichi hoist such vessel's ensign with the union down, or if there be no ensign on board, then he shall hoist any such other colours as shall be on board half mast, and continue the said signal so hoisted, until a Licence be had to remove the same from any one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the county of Northumberland under the penalty of ten pounds for each and every offence. And it is further ordered, That no vessel having on board the Small Pox, Yellow Fever, Putrid and Bilious Fever, or other pestilential or contagious distemper, or coming from any place infected with such distemper, or at which any such distemper at the time of her departure were known or supposed to prevail, or on board of which vessel any person during the voyage had died or been sick of any such distemper, shall come, proceed, or be navigated further from the sea into the river Miramichi than Saint Andrew's Church

sel, with all the persons, goods, and cargo on board thereof, to be removed to, and anchor at such place, and for such length of time (not exceeding forty days) as the said Justices, or any two of them, shall direct or appoint; and during the time such vessel shall be performing Quarantine, the master or commander thereof shall not permit any intercourse between the persons on board such vessel and the shore or shores, or between such vessel or any other vessel in the said harbour, except under the direction of said Physician or Surgeon; and the master or commander of every such vessel, and all and every person and persons belonging to, and being on board such ves sel, who shall disobey any such orders and directions as aforesaid, or shall neglect to execute and perform the same, or who shall come on shore or go on board any other vessel within the said harbour, or shall presume to bring or put, or aid and assist in bringing or putting on shore or on board of any other vessel as aforesaid, any person or any goods from any such vessel so having come to anchor, or which shall be ordered to perform Quarantine as aforesaid, without the licence or permission of the said Physycian or Surgeon being for that purpose first obtained, shall for each and every offence severally forfeit and pay the sum of ten pourds, current money of New Brunswick.

And it is further Ordered, That no person or persons whatsoever shall presume to approach within ten yards of any vessel lying at the Quarantine ground for inspection, until she shall have been examined by a Physician or Surgeon, and permission shall have been granted for her to proceed to her destination; nor within ten yards of any vessel performing Quarantine, except, under the order and by the direction of the said Physician or Surgeon, under the penalty of five pounds for each and every offence.

And it is further Ordered, That no vessel coming into the River Miramichi from any port or place in Great Britain or Ireland, having more than five passengers on board whether free from disease or not shall proceed or be navigated further from the sea into the River Miramichi than Saint Andrew's Church

until inspected by a Physician or Surgeon, and permission granted to proceed as aforesaid, under the penalty of ten pounds, to be paid by the master or commander of every such vessel.

And it is further Ordered, That the Physician or Surgeon going on board of any such vessel as aforesaid, shall C. be entitled to demand and receive from the master or commander of every such vessel the sum of thirty shillings for each and every visit so made by him.

And it is further Ordered, That the Clerk do forthwith cause the foregoing Orders to be printed, and furnish the respective Branch Pilots with copies thereof; and it shall be the duty of said Pilots respectively, on the first boarding of every vessel coming into the River Miramichi, to read the same to such master or commander of such vessel, or communicate to him the purport or effect thereof, and every Branch Pilot who shall neglect his duty in this respect, shall forfeit and pay for each and every offence the sum of ten pounds, to be recovered and applied as in and by the said herein before recited act is provided.
