January, 1842: Ordered—That no BULL or BULLS be allowed to run at large in any part of the Parishes of Chatham or Newcastle at any season of the year, under the penalty of FIVE SHILLINGS for each Ball so found running

or going at large. And further Ordered-That it be the duty Parishes of the Hogreeves in the respective Parishes to take up and impound any and every Bull so found running or going at large in violation of this Regulation.
