During the last fifteen years, the author has explored every district of Nova Scotia and New Bronswick. The last five years have been devoted to making a Geological Survey of the latter Province. His attention has also been directed to Emigration; and from the opportunities he has had for obtaining information, his descriptions will be given from actual observation, and his remark rived from practical experience.
