

ions of bales Still the market, uninfluenced by the heavy stock on hand, or the heavy stock which will shortly arrive, maintains its buoyancy, and speculation to a great extent is taking place. It is a singular fact, exemplifying the truth of the adage, that "when one door shuts another opens," that this extreme activity in the cotton market is not produced by our trade with the United States, which continues very depressed. Indeed, the stringent provisions of the American tariff have cut off the trade with this country to a mere bagatelle, and the improved feeling may be traced to the existence of new channels of consumption for British manufactured products.
