

Mr Conner gave notice that on the next day of meeting he would move the following resolution:

"That until our national rights of self legislation in the possession of our own Parliament, and of a valuation and a perpetuity of his farm to the tenant, be restored to us, we repealers shall pay no rent, county cess, rent charge, tithe, poor rate, or any other charge out of land."

This created great excitement, and after a very warm debate, resolutions strongly condemning Mr. Conner's proposition, as seditious and criminal, were unanimously passed, and decrees were held out that unless Mr Conner withdrew his motion his expulsion would follow.

In the County of Carlow, in several cases where seizures have been made for rent, the peasantry have congregated in considerable force at night, cut down the crops under seizure, and carried them off the lands, leaving the landlord the stubble.

FRANCE.—Some excitement was occasioned at Paris on the 17th ult., by the rumoured discovery of a treasonable conspiracy, and the arrest of the principals to the number of fifty and upwards.

Poland.—The National German Gazette of the 9th ult., announces that a new conspiracy had been discovered at Warsaw, and that more than 100 persons had been arrested.

Letters have been received from Erzerum to the 24th inst. On the 14th a large fire broke out there and consumed upwards of 300 shops, destroying property to the amount of at least seven million of piastres, a severe loss to so poor a place.

Manchester.—There has been more inquiries for cloth this week, the Calico printers are employed on the United States orders.

Staffordshire.—Great improvements continue in the iron trade.

Yorkshire and Lancashire the machine makers are very busy.

A great undertaking, to reclaim 100,000 acres of land from the sea, on the Norfolk and Lincolnshire coast, is in progress. It is to be called Father Mathew has returned to Ireland.

St. John New Brunswick, Oct. 14. An important Rumour, if true.—The Baltimore Sun states, that "for a day or two past, a panic has been prevalent in our city that adumbrated an important character had been re-assumed at Washington, that, at the instance of the late Spanish regent, the British Government had determined upon taking possession of Cuba, and had actually taken measures to that end."
