The numerous able works that have been written on Cauada have been the means of introducing the extensive improvements every where seen in that Province, compared with which New Branswick possess equal advan-tage — Asthe relief of the surplus population of the Mother Coun'ry and its transfretation to the noccopied Lands of her Colonies is of national importance, the chief object of the above work is to supply a full and accurate account of the Province with a view to its improvement by British emigrants and British capi-

During the last fifteen years, the author has explored every district of Nova Scotia and New Branswick. The last five years have been devoted to making a Geological Survey of the latter Province. His attention has also been directed to Emigration; and from the opportunities he has had for obtaining information, his descriptions will be given from actoal observation, and his remarks will be derived from practical experience.

Besides adverting briefly to the History and Aborigines of the Colony, the work will contain an account of its present state, its climate, opography, agricul uro, geology and mineralo gy, fisheries and other resources, trade, statis ties, and natural history, with remarks on emigration, and information for emigrants.
