EUROPEAN NEWS .- - The Royal Mail Steamer Britannia, arrived at Halifax on the afternoon of Wednesday, the 20th instant, after a passage of 15 days.

By the mail which was obtained at our Post Office, about ten o'clock yesterday morning, we received our usual files of British papers to the 5th of this month. The intelligence they contain is not very important. The London Shipping Gazette of the 4th instant, thus speaks of the trade of the country :

" The advices frem the manufacturing dis-The advices from the manufacturing dis-tricts of the north, and from Lacashire especi-ally, report the state of trade in the most fa-rourable terms. The manufacturers are said to be crowded with orders, and to be engaged for all the cotton fabrics they may make for weeks and mosths to come. The most satis-federed and enders that these rearrangementions do weeks and mosths to come. The most satis-factory evidence that these representations do not rest on a frail foundation, will be found in the fact, that the rates of wages have advan-ced in proportion. It is said, indeed, that in many instances, a fair advance has already been given been given.

The papers detail at great length, the account of the grand ceremony of opening the New Royal Exchange of London, which was attended by the Queen, accompanied by Prince Albert, all the Cabinet Ministers, Foreign Ambassadors, and other persons of distinction.

There is some news from the East Indies and China.

We have copied a number of extracts, which embrace all the intelligence worth extracting.

THE SEASON .- Old winter commenced his reign in right good earnest on Wednesday. During the whole of that day it was extremely cold, with a strong wind from the North-west, and ice made very fast in the river. On Thursday morning it was completely frozen across, and about noon yesterday, the Courier with the mails for the northward, crossed over

LIVERPOOL TIMBER MARKETS.
