The Duke of Wellington, who continues in the enjoyment of excellent health, completed his 75th year on the 1st May.

According to letters from Palermo, a complete famine reigned in Sicily, many persons in the interior having died of hunger. Yet the government had only just granted permission for the free importation of corn.

The iron roof of a building near the Bricklayers' Arms station, belonging to the Dover Railway, fell in last Thursday morning, caused the death of two workmen. Twelve others were seriously injured.

At a meeting of about 20,000 of the Northumberland pitmen, held on the Black Fell, near Newcastle-upon-Tyne, on Monday last, it was resolved not to resume work at the present wages, and to petition parliament for the removal of the export duty on coals.

Her Majesty's ship Fly has surveyed a passage in the Torres Straits, hitherto very little known. An island stands nearly in the centre, and thus there are two channels, one of three miles to the northward and four to the southward. Capt. Blackwood, we understand, intends to recommend that a beacon light be placed on the island.

The United Service Calcutta Gazette of February 9, states that a rumour was current, that Her Majesty's Brig of War Rapid, of ten guns, Lieut. commanding E. Earle, belonging to the Cape station, had been sunk near Denguela, after a smart fight with a Spanish slaver and that every soul on board had perished.

The interpreter to the Ojipway Indians was married at St. Martin's in the Fields, London, to a woman named Haymes. A great crowd were waiting the arrival of the wedding party, who came in a coach and four, and three carriages and pairs. Six of the Ojipway Indians were present, in full costume. The wedding party, on reaching the street, were received with cheers by the mob.

The London Punch says: "Gen. Tom Thumb has made his appearance at the Stock Exchange, and was universally allowed to be the smallest American stock ever known there: Pennsylvania dividends of course excepted."

Dr. Wolff left Tabiz on the 20th January, and after a perilous and painful journey, reached Teheran in perfect health, on the 4th February: he had obtained the assistance of a servant of Colonel Stoddart, who told him that people had been frequently detained for five years in prison at Bokara, and believed by all the inhabitants to be killed, and then suddenly had made their appearance again.
