BANKRUPT LAW .- The following well tim-

ed, and highly judicious remarks, we copy

"The opponents of the Bankrupt Law are

making strong efforts to procure its repeal, at the present sitting of the Legislature. It is a matter of great public consequence, and we believe is one of general interest, it therefore—we may respectfully suggest—becomes the Legis-

lature, in moving in so grave a matter, to see that its steps are taken with that caution, circumspection, and wisdom, which are due to the importance of the subject

"It appears to us, that the General Assembly in order to be induced to repeal the law, ought to require, not merely to be satisfied, that some few cases of fraud and hardship have resulted from it; but it should also be conclusively shown that some other law could be adopted, which while it will be equally productive of good will bring a smaller train of evils in its track. Weighty objections always apply to sudden changes in the law. Permanency, a stability—unflinching except for good and satisfactory causes, should be the golden rule in Provincial legislation. We do not mean, that changes are never necessary. It is well for those who are

never necessary. It is well for those who are actuated by a sincere desire of reform, to be

watchful, lest in their haste to bring about some intended good, they sugment the very evils which they seek to abolish or mitigate.

"It has been urged that great frauds have occurred under the Bankrupt laws—without poof

we remain somewhat sceptical on this point— but we would ask if enormous frauds have not been perpetrated before the Bankrupt laws were enacted? It would be impossible, we apprehend, to show, since the passage of these acts, that cases where the creditors have been defrauded by their dishonest debtors, have in-

defrauded by their dishonest debtors, have increased, either in number or flagrancy f character. No law can be adopted which can never seem to operate unjustly. The only criterion by which we can determine the character of a statute, is by its general effect. The mark of imperfection is stamped upon every act of human legislation, and, whilst we should always seek in this, as in everything else, the nearest approximation to perfection, its attainment it would be vain to expect. The only proper question is, not whether the law is always salutary in its influence? but can any

ways salutary in its influence? but can any system be found, which will be more generally

system be found, which will be more generally so? Our present Insolvent Law, operates so harshly in most instances, as it affects the liberty of the debtor, that we should rather be inclined to question the expediency of the repeal of the Bankrupt Law, until the insolvent acts undergo a wholesome revision, which may result in mitigating much of their rigor and unaccessary severity."
