"We understand the Writs for the new Elections are already issued—that for Charlotte T. wa to commence on the 16th, and that for the 2d Electoral District of Queen's County on the 19th January next."

The Rev. WM. HENDERSON, of Salisbury, will preach in St. James's Church, Newcastle, on Sunday next, the 7th instant, at 11 o'clock, in the forenoon, on which time, (as usual) the annual collection will be taken.

Three Slavers Captured.—Capt. Howard, of the Ida, arrived at New York in fifty nine days from Sierra Leone, reports that a few days before he sailed the British brig of war Eury captured three Brazilian slavers, one having on board 538 slaves. The vessels had been condemned and sold, the slaves liberated, and the crew allowed to go at liberty.

The Command of the Troops in this Province has devolved on Major Whynates, of the Royal Engineers, the senior Officer in this Colony.

FROM HAYTI.—The Brig Angelina, Captain Barnes, arrived at New Orleans on the 7th inst. from Port Republica, [formerly Port au Prince.] One new rumour comes by this arrival. It is stated that the Haytian Government has received overtures from Great Britain for certain commercial privileges, for which England offers as a consideration, to redeem the French claims for indemnity against that Island; taking in return the bonds of Hayti.
