Ordered, That the following Rules, Regula-tions, and Restrictions, for the semi-asnual FAIRS, to be holden at the Town of Newcas-tle, in the county of Northumberland, under the

tle, in the county of Northumberland, ander the provisions of an Act of the General Assembly, nade and passed in the eighth year of the reign of Mer, present Majesty, shall continue and be in force until annulled, altered, or amended by any subsequent. Order of this Court.

1 That the Fair shall be holden on the pub-lic square in the Town of Newcastle.

2. That the Fair shall commence and be open on the second TUESDAYS in October and Merch next, at the hour of 10, A. M., and continu-till the hour of 5, P. M., when the Fair shall close for that day; and be sgain open on the following day, between the same hours; but not to continue beyond two days at any one Par

not to continue beyond two days at any one Far. 3. 
