Medical aid was secured, and the bowels which protruded through the wound were put back, and the wound sewed up. Forshner was apprehended and is now in Jail.

The North America.—This Steamer has got into very bad odour with the Newfoundlanders. It is said that another survey has been ordered to be held on this vessel by Her Majesty's Government, founded on statements made by the Press of Newfoundland, and that, if such Survey is effected, the Boat, to a certainty, will never be put upon the route between this Port and St John again.

West-Indies.

Tobago.—From a number of the Chronicle, newspaper, of the above named Island, dated Jan. 23d, and which came to hand on Friday last, we extract the following distressing intelligence:—

"Never do we recollect to have seen so much sickness, and so many deaths among the natives, as at this season. There is scarcely a family, in and about town, wherein some of its members are not afflicted with fever, or some other disease. The gentlemen of the medical profession have enough to occupy their time and employ their talents at present."

Barbadoes Globe, Feb 3.

On Friday a whirlwind passed over a part of the city and its suburbs, which occasioned much alarm to the inhabitants. It was particularly severe in the vicinity of White Park Road, and on the wharf some trifling damage is said to have been done by it.

United States News.

National Intelligencer, March 18.

We understand that the members of the Diplomatic Corps waited upon the President of the U. States yesterday in a body, and, through their senior, the Minister of Russia, made an address to him, on the occasion of his accession to the Presidency, expressive of the friendly sentiments entertained towards the United States by the Sovereigns and Governments whom they represent, and of their earnest desire to continue to maintain the existing friendly and peaceful relations between this country and theirs; to which address the President made a fitting reply, reciprocating these sentiments on his part as the Chief Magistrate of his own country.

The Mexican Minister arrived at New-York on Friday, for the purpose of taking passage for home. The following is an abstract of a protest made by him to the Secretary of state, previous to his leaving Washington—

The undersigned has the honour to address himself to the Hon. Secretary of State, in order to manifest the deep concern with which he has seen that the President of the United States has given his signature to a law admitting into this confederacy the Mexican Province of Texas.

He had flattered himself that the sound councils of the most distinguished citizens, &c. would have led to a better result. Unhappily, it has not been so, and against his hopes and sincere vows, he sees consummated on the part of this government, an act of aggression the most unjust that modern history records—the spoliation by a friendly nation of considerable part of its territory.

For these reasons, in obedience to his instructions, he must protest, and does protest, in the most solemn manner, in the name of his government, against the law, &c. He protests also that the act in a measure invalidates the rights of Mexico to recover her Province, of which she is so unjustly dispossessed, and that she will maintain and give effect to those rights by all means within her power.

He also begs that the Secretary will let the President know that, in view of all these facts, his mission near this government terminates from to-day. He consequently begs that the Hon. Secretary will forward to him his passports, because it is his purpose to leave this city as soon as possible for New York. ALMONTE.

It is stated that the Mexican Consul in New Orleans (Senor Anaugoiz,) has received instructions to close the consulate in that city, and that he intends doing so previous to the 1st of April.
