He agrees exactly with Mr Wilmot, that the office of Provincial Secretary should be filled by those whose long and faithful services to their country justly entitle them to the claim of such patronage, and the confidence of the people; which simply amounts to this, that because a person has had a situation under government with a handsome salary attached (for I fancy few men can be found who serve their country here at least without) for a long time, that he is the person to whom the patronage of the Crown should be extended, and others are to be totally neglected. Such a person has in my humble opinion, Mr Editor, just about as much claim to the patronage of the Crown, as Veritas has to native genius in the sense it is generally understood. And there can be but little doubt but this extraordinary youth, who so nobly stands forth as a martyr in the cause of native genius, would prefer seeing merit rewarded according to its desert, than otherwise, and soon indeed, then, would the people have cause to rejoice at an event which necessarily would shortly follow—a county Dominion would become Provincial Secretary.
