day later, containing the highly interest-ing intelligence copied below. Highly Important from Mexico,—Bal-timore, Wednesday night.—Dates from Vera Cruz, to June 1st. have been re-ceived at Charleston, by the way of Hayana Havana.

The Consuls of the neutral nations, resident at Vera Cruz, had protested against the blockade of that port.

The Mexican Congress met on the 27th wir. Ex-President Bustamente, being appointed President of the same. It is generally believed he will be elected President.

It is said that Paredes will march over to Matamoras, at the head of a strong army,-the largest portion composed of the body of troops, called the reserve. The time for his departure with this army is already fixed, but has not been made pablic. Gen. Bravo will occupy the Presidential chair, ad interim.

The suspension of payments continues, aud things generally remain in the worst condition

The Mexican government had called a The Mexican government had called a meeting for the purpose of procuring re-sources, which it was believed could hardly be obtained, as the clergy are not able to pay the amount of \$90,000 monthly already demanded by the Go-vernment; and, on the other hand, the actual condition of the several States is not such as to expect from them any resources.

New Orleans papers of the 8th, 9th and 10th inst, have been received in which we find the following.

General Taylor's son has left for New Orleans for Matamoras, with his father's


