

the soldiers to flight. A large body of soldiers was immediately sent out, and marched against them, the greater part of whom after a somewhat severe conflict, were arrested and lodged in prison.

A workman was yesterday condemned to a year's imprisonment and 500f. fine, for having used in a public place insulting expressions respecting the King.

Yesterday was the fourth anniversary of the melancholy death of his Royal Highness the Duc d'Orleans, the King's eldest son. The King, Queen, and royal family went as usual to his burial place and attended the solemn mass offered for the repose of his soul. Of all the royal family the deceased prince was most beloved; and had he lived, his accession to the throne, on his father's death, would have been hailed by acclamation.

Accounts from Algiers represent Abdel-Kader as flying before the French, and as in a state of most pitiable distress. They represent also that the people are disgusted with him, and refuse him all assistance. But they have said the same thing so often, and the result has proved it to be so untrue, that in this case we must not attach much credit to it. The General Carignac has taken a terrible vengeance on the tribe that committed the slaughter of Dgeinina-Gazaouat. He has also seized large flocks of sheep, and killed some score or two of men belonging to some other tribes.

The harvest will be very fine this year but the crops have sustained some little injury by the long drought followed by high winds. The vines are in excellent condition, and will yield abundant crops, which will make most excellent wine.

ITALY.—*Milan, July 10.*—The six cardinals comprising the temporary commission of government had disagreed among themselves, and that Cardinals Lambruschini, Mattei, and Berneti had tendered their resignation. A full amnesty was to be published in a few days. The Pope signed on the 29th the pardon of Professor Orioli, Minister of Public Instruction during the revolution of 1831. His Holiness intended to permit the construction of railroads through the papal dominions, and to introduce various reforms in the administration. Several inhabitants of Rome having been arrested, and the governor being unable to assign any satisfactory reason for that measure, the Pope ordered the prisoners to be immediately restored to liberty. The Military Commissions of Bologna, Ravenna, and Rimini had been dissolved. It was reported at Turin that Austria had addressed a note to the Sardinian government, complaining of the protection it afforded several notorious revolutionists, and demanding the dismissal from their respective offices of M. Balbu, the author of a work entitled "The Prospects of Italy," and of the Marquis d'Azeglio, another distinguished writer. A negative reply has been returned to the note.

Letters from Naples that Vesuvius has been making great noise, and vomiting forth smoke and flame which at night presents a magnificent spectacle.
