Chester and Holyhead .- One of the great iron tubes to form the bridge over the river Conway is completed, and the operations for raising it to the intended site, adjacent to the walls of Conway casile, will be commenced in the course of the present month. It exceeds 1,000 of the present month. It exceeds 1,000 tons in weight, being 400 feet long, and 30 feet in height. It now stands on a platform overhanging the Conway. It is intended to float it in a mass down the river, on pontoons, and raise it bodily on to the abatments by means of hydraulic presses.
