ragraph on the weather. So far with us the present winter may be considered mild, but remarkably changeable and stormy—having alreedy had what may be considered two January thaws. On Monday night and Tuesday morning we had a heavy gale of wind from the South-East, with snow and rain, the wind gradually changing to the Southward and Westward. Several vessels sailed on Monday for Europe, and one of them, a Barque, was signalled off the Harbour on Tuesday afternoon, but the wind hauling more to the Northward, she stood down the Bay again. On Thursday night and Friday morning, we experimenced another very heavy blow, accompanied, at intervals, by heavy showers of rain. The wind on Thursday after-noon was from the Eastward, and the air mild for the season, but during the night it changed to the South-East, and wore round, South-wardly, ill it got to West, blowing heavily, and at times most violently, until last evening. The air yesterday was cold, and the vessels in the harbour made considerable ice last night. We have not heard of any material damage having been sustained by the vessels in port. damage having been sustained by the vessels in port.

The Courier speaks of the necessity there exists of having a harbour of re-fuge in the Bay of Funday, and recom-mends that a Breakwater be erected at Dipper Harbour for that purpose, and that a petition requesting aid, be present-ed at the next meeting of the Legislature.


