UNITED STATES.—From Mexico.—The most important news we have this week from Mexico is the return to Mexico of Gen. Paredez, whom Santa Anna superseded in power. He reached Vera Cruz on the 14th August, in the British Mail Steamer Leviot, under an assumed name. On his arrival he is stated to have leaped into the first boat alongside, and landed at the mole, and was past the gates of the city in less than thirty minutes. One hundred dollars were offered for his arrest, as soon as the information reached the U. States commander; but it was too late—the bird had flown.

A courier who left Puebla on the 7th, states that the Army under Gen. Scott commenced its march for the city of Mexico on that day, agreeably to announcement. It was expected to have hard fighting on the road.

GREAT FIRE.—The large Octagon building at the corner of Ann and Nassau streets, owned by the Van Rensselaer family, and occupied by Messrs. James Conner & Sons, stereotypers, was entirely destroyed by fire, on Sunday night last. The loss of J. C. & Sons, is reported at \$30,000 over their insurance. Mr. Applegate, copperplate and letter press printer, has lost \$2000, insured. Mr. Mercers refectory, lost \$6000, not insured. J. W. Bell, printer, lost \$5000. There were also several other small losses.—*St. John Courier, September 4.*

THE ADMIRAL.—On the arrival of the steamer Admiral, at Portland on the 26th inst. the Mayor of that City refused to allow the passengers to land, unless bonds were given that they would not become paupers, or commutation money was first paid into the City Treasury, to the amount of \$4 each, making no distinction between cabin and steerage passengers. There were a number of ladies on board, whose husbands and friends were waiting to receive them on the wharf. The cabin passengers consented to proceed to Boston rather than submit to a gross imposition. The Admiral arrived at Boston at 10 o'clock, at night, where the passengers were landed. A meeting was held in her cabin on the 26th inst., when Albert Pillsbury, Esquire, of East Machias, was called to the Chair, and George F. Noys, Esquire of Boston, acted as Secretary; some stringent resolutions were unanimously passed, which were signed by the Chairman, Secretary and remainder of the cabin passengers who were American citizens.
