LIVERPOOL TIMBER MARKET.—The following is an extract from Chaloner and Fleming's Circular on the Timber Trade:—

"The arrivals of this month from British America consist of seven vessels, 5107 tons, against nine vessels 4157 tons in the same month last year. There has been a fair consumptive demand, more particularly in the supply of railway requirements, and there has been some improved feeling in the market with firmer prices."
