REWARD.

WHEREAS on the night of Sunday the 26th of November, being the Sunday before last, some person took from the cart-yard of the Subscriber a long, low, Truck or Dray, one wheel of which broke down with the party on the following night, on the back road leading from Michael Noonan's farm, in rear of Chatham, towards the Richibucto Road, and immediately opposite the barn of John Kean.
