EUROPEAN NEWS.—We copy below a summary of European News, received by the Collins steamer Arctic...

From the Halifax Church Times, of Friday last.

The United States Mail Steamer Arctic, Captain Luce, came into this port, rather unexpectedly, this morning, short of coal.

We have been obliged by the kindness of the second officer of the ship, Mr Ayre, with the loan of a complete file of English papers from the 5th to the 11th, instant.

The French Ministry had been compelled to resign, owing to a succession of defeats. A new ministry might be formed...

Upon the whole, the news is of a decidedly unimportant character. The papers with which we have been favored, have scarcely a paragraph relative to the Papal aggression...

IRELAND.—Dublin, Jan. 7.—The Tenant League Movement.—The chiefs of the Tenant League have carried the war into the midland counties...

Though the meeting was not as numerous as many that have been held on the same question, owing in a great degree, it was stated, to the efforts made by the landlords to prevent their tenantry from attending...

ROME.—The accounts from Rome state that the activity of Mazzini and other Italian refugees, gives no reason to doubt but that any serious difficulty at Paris would be instantly seized upon to unfurl the Republican banner in the Holy City...

TURKEY.—Constantinople, Dec. 15.—The news from Bosnia is satisfactory. The rebels have been everywhere beaten by Omar Pacha, who is endeavoring to introduce such reforms as are necessary for the peace of that Province...

The Gomer Polish announces, that the affair of the Hungarian refugees has been finally arranged. America has offered them an asylum, which they have accepted...

GERMANY.—Hamburg is now occupied by Prussian troops only, in case the duchies propose an active resistance to the proceedings of Prussia and Austria.

Letters from Rome announce that the United States residents in that city have resolved on resistance to the Pope's order to close their chapel.

We understand that Mr Roebuck, Q. C., and Mr Sergeant Wilkins, are specially retained to defend the parties lately committed for trial for the riots at Birkenhead...

The Quickest Yet.—The Cunard steamer Asia, Capt. Judkins, from New York, arrived at Liverpool on the 28th Dec., in ten days four hours and five minutes from dock to dock...

The resignation of the Navarres cabinet in Spain is again reported.

It is announced that the Dublin and Galway Railway will be opened to travellers on the first June.

A fire broke out in the coach-building establishment of Messrs Hutten & Summerhill, Dublin, on the 4th, which destroyed property to the value £30,000.

NOVA SCOTIA.—The Legislature of this Province was opened on Thursday last. The Speech of Sir John Harvey is unusually short, and does not contain anything of special interest.

The Line of Telegraph, it is stated, has paid 84 per cent.

UNITED STATES.—A new Postage Bill has passed the House of Representatives, establishing three cents as the Postage on each letter not exceeding half-ounce in weight...

Great Fire at New Orleans.—The St. Charles Hotel—the pride of the South—with Klapp's Church in Poydras Street, and other buildings, were destroyed by fire on the 18th instant. The loss is estimated at not less than half a million of dollars.

LATER FROM CALIFORNIA.—Another fire had occurred at San Francisco, destroying property to the amount of \$100,000. The fire commenced in Cook & Brother's store foot of Sacramento street.

The Cholera had finally disappeared both from San Francisco and Sacramento City. The news from the mines is generally of a favorable character. The miners were hard at work, and their labors yield a fair return.

The Stockton Journal records a collision in the vicinity of Grulhama Hill, in which fifteen Americans and a large number of Indians were killed.

The cholera has entirely disappeared from Kingston, Jamaica.

An exceedingly rich silver placer has been discovered a few leagues from Monterey where a company is forming to work the mines upon an extensive scale.
