

Votes in favor of the Government, to which Mr Johnson moved as an amendment that it do not come in force until the establishment of Municipal Corporations. The amendment was lost, 23 to 11, and the original Resolution carried 16 to 12.

Mr Earle afterwards moved a re-consideration of the Resolution in favor of giving up the Initiation of Money Votes to the Executive, which was carried 22 to 14. Mr Needham then moved that it be postponed until next session, when the motion was sustained, 20 to 16.—*New Brunswick.*

On Friday, the House, on motion of Mr Scoullar, and after considerable discussion, passed, by a majority of one, a Resolution yielding up to the Executive the initiation of money votes. A Resolution, introduced by Mr Hannington, was also passed, reducing the number of Judges including the Master of the Rolls, to four.

The sum of £60 was granted for fuel for Government House. The member's pay bill has passed the Council.

In the Legislative Council on the 15th, the Hon. Messrs. Robertson, Saunders, Hatch, and Odell, were appointed a select Committee to prepare an Address to Her Majesty on the subject of an Elective Legislative Council.

The following additional items of Legislative news were copy from the Telegraphic report to the News Room:

In Committee of Supply a grant of £500 was passed, on motion of Mr Gray, for the encouragement of the Fisheries, and vote to Mr Taylor was reconsidered, and £100 granted. This closed the Committee of Supply. The amount voted was stated to be within the estimate.

*Saturday, April 26.*—The Bill granting further facility to the European and North American Railway, by grants of land to the Company, comes on for discussion to day.—*Saint John Courier.*

*The Arrivals.*—During the week, upwards of thirty vessels have arrived in our harbor from foreign ports, the most of them being of a large size. Several cargoes of spring goods have also come to hand from Great Britain, which will make quite a stir among our merchants for some time to come. The harbor now presents a very animated appearance, with so many vessels, besides the number of handsome new ones now fitting out; and it is generally expected that there will be some improvement in the times in this city during the ensuing summer as compared with the three last years.

The amount of Revenue collected at the Treasury Office, yesterday, was about £2700.—*St. John Courier.*

**UNITED STATES.—Great Conflagration.—150 Houses Destroyed.**—The Pacific News of the 15th, states that an extensive conflagration had occurred at Nevada City. The fire which is supposed to have been the work of incendiaries, originated about 12 o'clock on Tuesday night, in the Bowling Alley of Gates & Smith, on Cayote street. One hundred and fifty buildings were destroyed, and the loss is estimated at one million of dollars.

**ARRIVAL OF THE ASIA AT NEW YORK.**

The Asia arrived from Liverpool at New York, on Wednesday morning, at 11 o'clock, with dates to the 12th inst. She had 79 passengers.

In Parliament Lord John Russell's Ministry still maintained their position, they are well sustained on the Papal Aggression Bill, and on the assessed taxes Bill they had a majority of 73. Almost all the Bishops had issued circulars, expressing a firm determination to resist the Papal Aggression. The Continental news is of much interest; The insurrection in Bosnia is nearly quelled.

*The duties on Foreign Timber have been reduced one half.*
