YESTERDAY'S MAIL.

The papers by this mail furnish but little news. We copy below a few paragraphs.

NEW BRUNSWICK.—The Hon. Mr Howe left this city on Monday last, and arrived at St. Andrews on the following morning. A public meeting was called at that place, and the honorable gentleman explained his views on the Halifax and Quebec Railroad, in a speech of over an hour in length. The Standard says that the assemblage was graced by the presence of a number of ladies.

Lauchlan Donaldson, Esq., in an appropriate speech, introduced the following resolution, which was seconded by John Wilson Esq., and carried unanimously:—

Resolved, That the inhabitants of St. Andrews have listened with great pleasure to the eloquent address just delivered by the Hon. Jos. Howe, and sincerely hope that he may, by his ability, determination, and perseverance, be able to effect such a combined effort among these Colonies, in regard to Railroads, as will result in their general prosperity, their more intimate intercourse with each other, and their happiness.—*St. John New Brunswicker.*

The members of the Executive Committee have returned from Portland. Resolutions were passed unanimously declaring their unabated confidence in the European and North American Railroad, and their belief that the required stock will be subscribed in the United States. No further action, we understand, will be taken until after the sitting of the Government Convention at Toronto. Mr Howe attended the meeting of the Committee.—*St. John Freeman.*

Fire.—A range of buildings adjacent to Capt. Charles Brown's Mills, near the Falls, and occupied by the workmen, was destroyed by fire on Sunday morning last, without, however, doing any damage to the mills.—*St. John Courier.*

UNITED STATES.—*Gold Mines.*—The *Hallowell Gazette* of the 7th inst., has some items in regard to the recent discoveries of gold mines in Maine. The paper says there is no doubt that gold may be obtained in large quantities in the northern part of Maine, in the streams that empty into the Penobscot and Chaudiere. Individuals are getting from \$20 to \$40 per day. Rumors are prevalent, and uncontradicted, of from \$50 to \$200 being taken out in one day. It is estimated that 2000 men are now on their way to the diggings, many coming from Boston and New York. A lump of gold weighing \$7 was exhibited at Waterville last week, which was found on the Maine side of the boundary.

SHOCKING OCCURRENCE.—The brigantine *David*, of Galway, sailed from Dalhousie, Restigouche, for Ulverston, in Lancashire, about 10th December last. On the 14th, the vessel was struck with a heavy sea whilst lying-to, thrown on her beam ends, and the cook washed overboard. She shortly afterwards righted and filled. The crew subsisted for four days on a few turnips which floated out of the cabin, when the captain and mate died. The rest of the crew, four in number, were taken off the wreck eight days after the disaster occurred, by the schooner *Brothers*, of Halifax, and carried into Harbor Britain. Another of these unfortunate men died two days afterwards, one finally recovered, and the other two arrived here on Thursday, one with the loss of the right leg and all the toes of the left foot, the other having suffered the loss of the greater part of both feet.—*Newfoundland Times, May 24.*

It is now thought that Galway will be the first port of destination of the transatlantic steamer *North America*, now nearly ready for sea at New York. It is said that Galway is from 25 to 40 hours sail nearer than Liverpool to an American port.—*Boston Traveller.*
