THE MAINE LIQUOR LAW. - The Judges of the Supreme Court of New Hampshire bave declared the Maine Liquor Law unconstitutional on eight separate and distinct grounds. Because it confers on Justices of the Peace an extent of authority not contemblated by the Constitution: Because it sets aside trial by Jury and the right of appear to a higher tribunal: Because it provides that all mortgages, &c., which in whole of part shall be for, or on account of spirituous liquors, shall be void, &c., and also that no action shall be maintained in any court of the State, either in whole or in part for intoxicating liquors sold in any other State or

country, whereas the Constitution and the Bill of Rights give every citizen the right to recover any debt. A debt is binding, or otherwise according to the law of the coun-try or State where it is contracted, and no law of the State could deprive the citizen of bn another State, of the right of enforcing it in their tribunals : Because, as liquors are property, it is impossible to reconcile it to general principles, that the owners thereof should not have the right to sue for their recovery in the courts of the State : Because the 11th section imposes a penalty on de persons appealing, of a double fine in case the sentence be confirmed, a principle subversive of the rights of ctuizens. Unless the right of appeal can be wholly taken away, and parties be deprived of all right to trial by Jury, this clause cannot be supported

Because excessive Bail is required ; be-cause an impartial trial is not secured, the proof that an offence, under the law, was committed on a man's premises, even though he knew nothing of it, being sufficient to procure his purishment-and thus the innocent would suffer for the guilty; because, contrary to the spirit of the Con stitution it exposes persons to have their houses searched without a warrant, and on mere verbal informations. &c., &c.
