"A Bill to revive an Act, in addition to an Act, intitled an Act, to enable the Justices of the Peace for the several Counties in this Province, for the time being, to receive for public uses Grants of Land lying in their respective Counties, and to regulate the Commons belonging to the several Townships or Parishes within the same."

1. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor Council and Assembly, that an Act made and passed in the tenth and eleventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intitled "An Act in addition to an Act intitled an Act to enable the Justices of the Peace for the several Counties in this Province or the time being to receive for public uses Grants of Land lying in their respective Counties and to regulate the Commons belonging to the several Townships or Parishes within the same," be and the same is hereby declared to be revived, and in full force and effect.
