RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1st. No Premium shall be awarded for any article of Domestic Manufacture, Grains, Seeds, or Produce of the Dairy, which has not been wholly manufactured, raised or prepared for exhibition, within this County.
2nd. That all articles to be Exhibited, must have been manufactured, raised, or produced, within one year from the date of competition.
3rd. That the prizes for Domestic Manufactures, shall be open to general competition, but persons having won prizes to the amount of 10s. and upwards, for Manufactures, shall pay the Annual Subscription of 5s. out of said prizes.
