GAOL REGULATIONS.

At a General Session of the Pease, of our Lady the Queen, held at the Court Mouse, Newcastle, in and for the County of Northumberland, on Tuesday, the Eleventh say of Juy, in the year of our Lord One Thousant Eight Hundred and Fifty

Four. Ordered, that the following Rules and Regulations be made and established in pursuance of the authority vested in the General Sessions, by Act of Assumbly, 13 Vict, Cap 30. "For the Regulation and management of Gaols and Work Houses."

I The Gaoler to inspect the Cells once in the teach.

I The Gaoler to inspect the Cells once in the twenty-f ur hours.

Ile Debury to he kept apart from prisoners, charged with eciminal offences.

III The Gaoler to keep a record of all parties committed, whether for cebt or charge of offence, to be laid before the Coheral Sessions, if required.

IV. Every prisoner maintained at the public expence, shall be allowed a sufficient quantity of abole some food, to be regulated by the General Sessions.

pence, shall be allowed a strictent quantity of whot some food, to be regulated by the General Sections

V Prisoners, whether confined for debt. or before trial for any sopposed (fince, shall be allowed to procure for themselves, and receive at proper times, any food, bedding, cloths or such other necessaries as may be sanctioned by the Gaol Committee.

VI. No person who is confined under Sentence of any Cours, nor any prioner confined in pursuance of a Conviction, before a Justice, shall beceive any other f od that the Goal allowance, except under special circumstances, such as sickness, &c.

VII Prisoners behaving riotocally or disorderly in the Goal, to be put on milf allowance of food.

VII. The Geal shall be provided with suitable bidding, and not more than two persons to sleep on one stretcher.

IX. The friends of prisoners for debt, may visit them at reasonable and proper hours of the day, compatable with security. Prisoners committed for felony or misdemeanour, may be visited by their friends, by permission of the Gaol committee, in presence of the Caoler.

X. The walls of the cells to be whitewashed at least twice in the year, and the Goors washed once a week, i, there be any prisoners confined; an adequate allowance of water and soap, with towels, to be allowed prisoners.

XII No intoxicating liquors to be allowed in the Goal, for the use of prisoners, unless in case of sickness.

XII No gaming to be allowed, and lights in the seeks to be extinguished at ten o'clock in the even-

XIII. In case of alarming ickness or serious ac XIII. In case of alarming rectuess of serious accident to any prisoner, the gaof committee may call in a Sargeon, if they think it necessary.
