

Such of the said five bridges as may be absolutely necessary, to be constructed the present year; the others to be placed in a position to be finished the next one, the same being in lieu of the balance unexpended of the grant of £10,000 for certain bridges as particularized the last session, and in lieu also of the authority given the Government by law, "to expend such sums as may be indispensably required to construct any other bridge or bridges on any of the several Great Roads, where such bridges shall be estimated to cost a sum not less than £300 or upwards."

Read the petition of John M. Johnson, Chairman of a Sanitary Committee for Chatham, in the County of Northumberland, praying the sum of £9 8s. be granted him as chairman, to reimburse the committee moneys expended in procuring disinfecting materials, and other measures to prevent the prevalence of cholera in that district; and also the further sum of £10 to remunerate the Secretary of said committee for services performed in that capacity, be complied with.

Your Committee also, on the certificate of Edward Williston, Clerk of the Peace for the County of Northumberland, recommend that there be granted to the Sessions of said County, £7 10s to reimburse expenses incurred, according to said certificate, in precautionary measures taken by them in the district of Newcastle.

March 29.

Read a third time as engrossed, a bill for the better execution and improvement of the Great Roads and Public Works. Resolved that the bill do pass.

On motion of Mr Lunt, the House went into Committee of the whole on a bill relating to the repairing of Bye Roads and Bridges in this Province.

It was moved—that they proceed to the consideration thereof, by taking the same up section by section.

Upon the question, the Committee divided—Yeas 12. Nays 8. And it was thereupon carried in the affirmative.

The first section therefore was then read, and which enacts—"that all moneys granted for the improvement and repairing of Bye Roads and Bridges thereon, shall be drawn by warrant of the Governor in council upon the Provincial Treasurer, in favour of the Commissioners of roads for the several Towns and Parishes."

To which it was moved as an amendment—to expunge the said section, and substitute in place thereof—"that the persons now by law authorized to elect certain Parish Officers at the Public Meetings in the respective Parishes, held by law for the election of such officers, shall be authorized to elect one or more persons, not exceeding three, as Commissioners in each Parish, to expend the whole of the money granted or appropriated for the Bye Roads in such Parish."

The question being taken upon the said proposed amendment, when the Committee divided—Yeas 11. Nays 7. And it was thereupon carried in the affirmative, and the amendment section adopted.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor a sum not exceeding £300 for the purpose of constructing a Draw in the Bridge over the Buctouche River, in the County of Kent.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor the sum of £200 to be applied towards removing obstructions and improving the navigation of the South West Branch of the River Miramichi.
